FETP was established with the mission to support and promote economic reforms in Vietnam towards the market economy

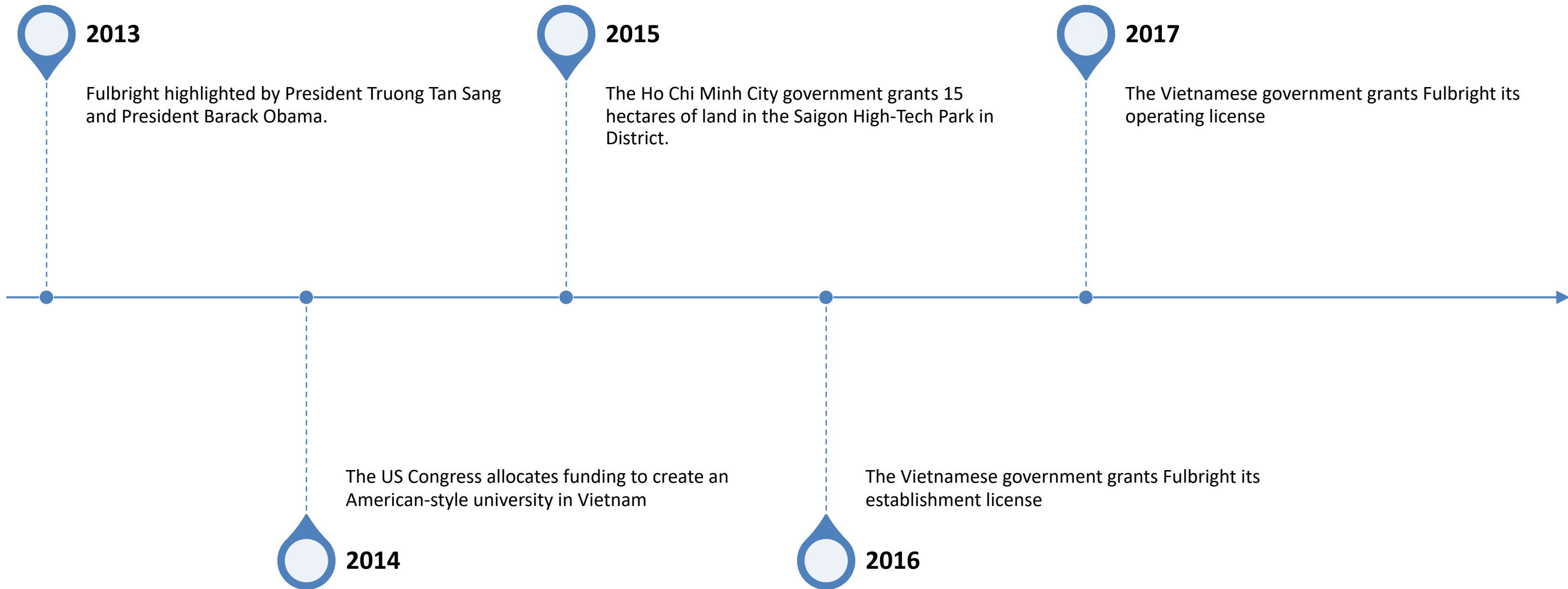

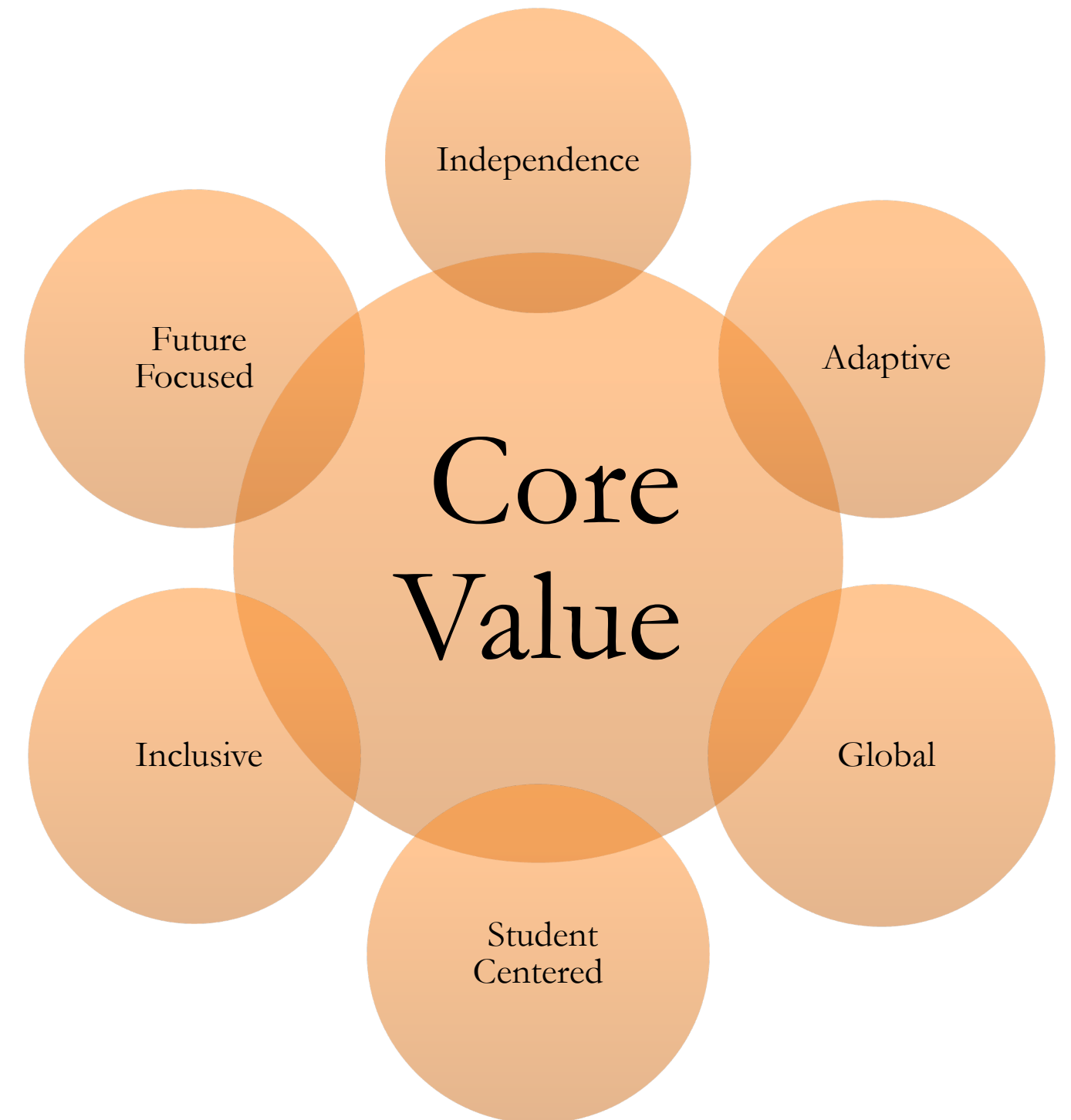
OUR VISION

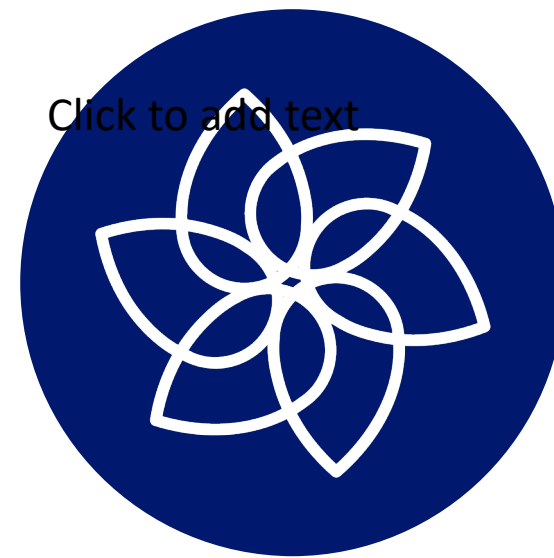
LIBERAL ART UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM CURRICULUM



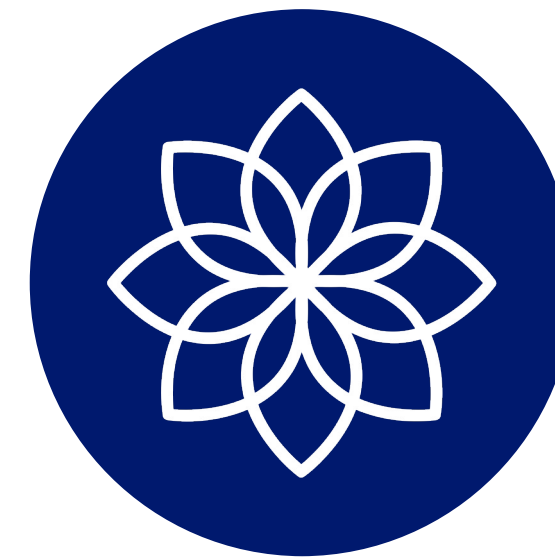

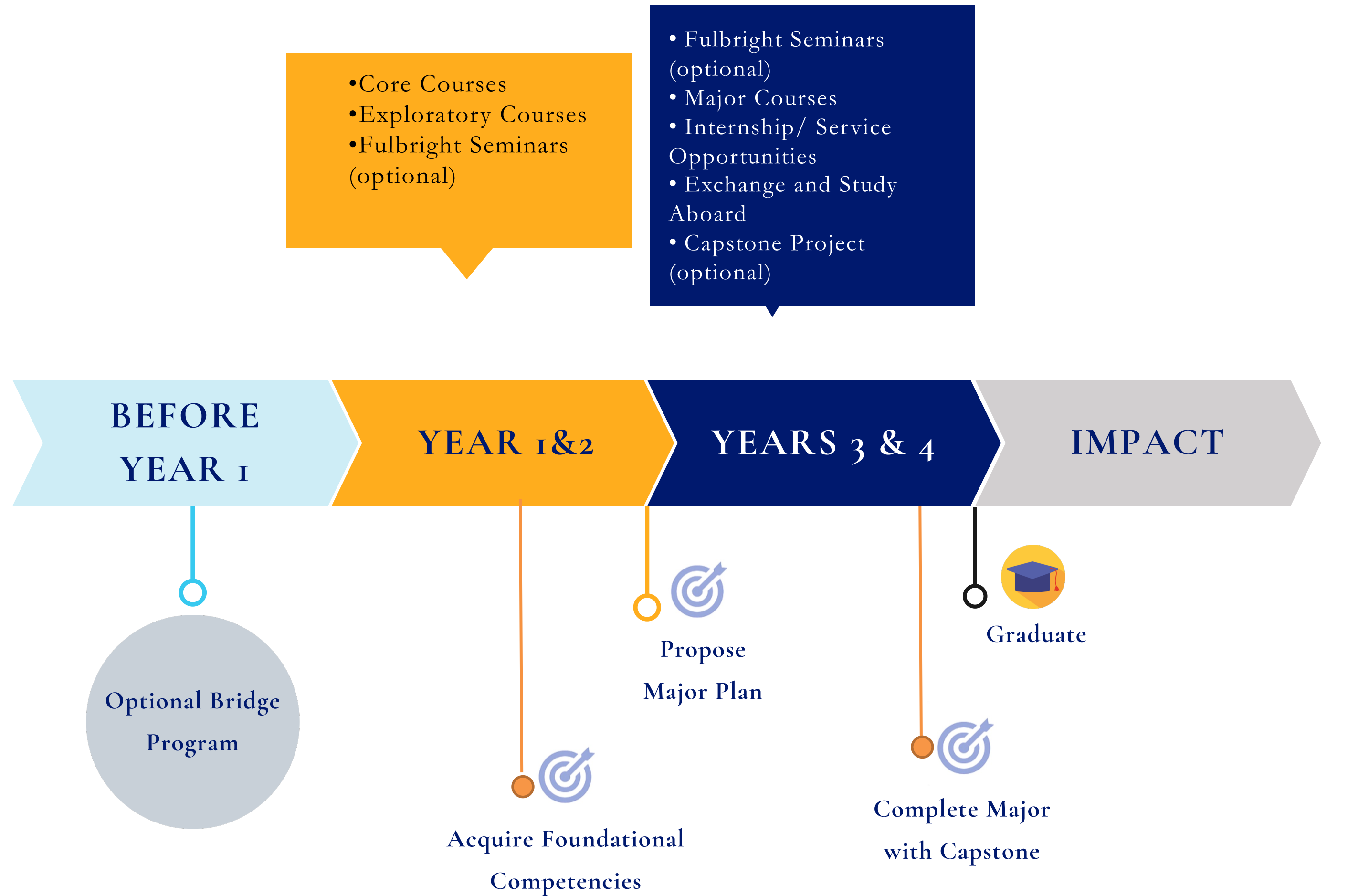

BRIDGE PROGRAM

For those seeking added language and learning support prior to starting the undergraduate program, Fulbright has a seven-week Bridge Program that runs the summer prior to the start of classes. For those of you who participate, you will work with our outstanding faculty and staff to prepare for the start of your first-year academic experience.



UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

All students are required to complete some experiential learning (EL) credits. Students can choose to complete their EL on or off campus depending on the activity. Supporting their EL, all students take a one-semester, 90-minute per week corresponding class. The EL can fall in one of the following categories: Internship, Service Learning, or Guided Independent Research.



CAPSTONE PROJECT (optional)

Liberal Education. Fulbright's undergraduate program is based on the American tradition of the liberal arts and sciences. Exploring across a range of disciplines, all students develop foundational knowledge and skills for a lifetime of learning, professional success, and civic engagement. Students concentrate their studies in a major topic of significant depth and interest, culminating in a final Capstone Project. Moreover, Fulbright's curriculum transcends singular disciplines and provides students with transdisciplinary learning opportunities.

- All courses were designed with student centered – active learning approach
- A range of courses focusing on Vietnam: Arts, Social sciences, History... Some are co-designed and co-taught by faculty of FUV and Princeton/Dartmouth/Utah
- NASPAA accredited master program in Public Policy and Management with strong relation to Vietnamese policy makers
- Started the accreditation process with NECHE

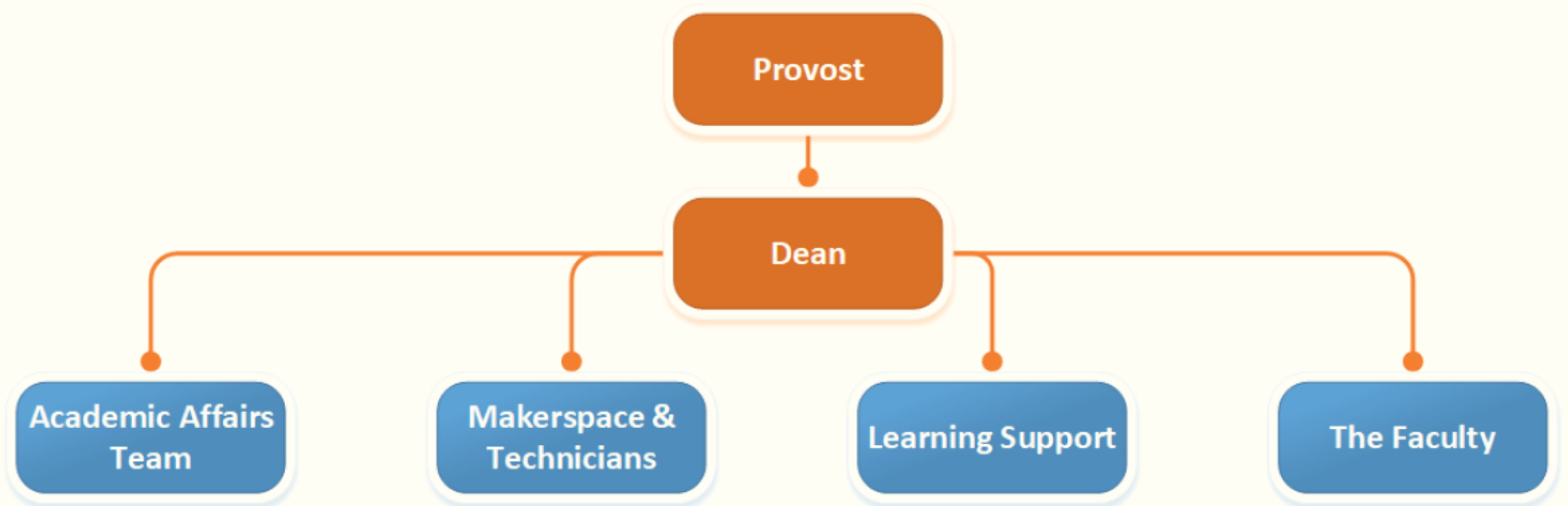

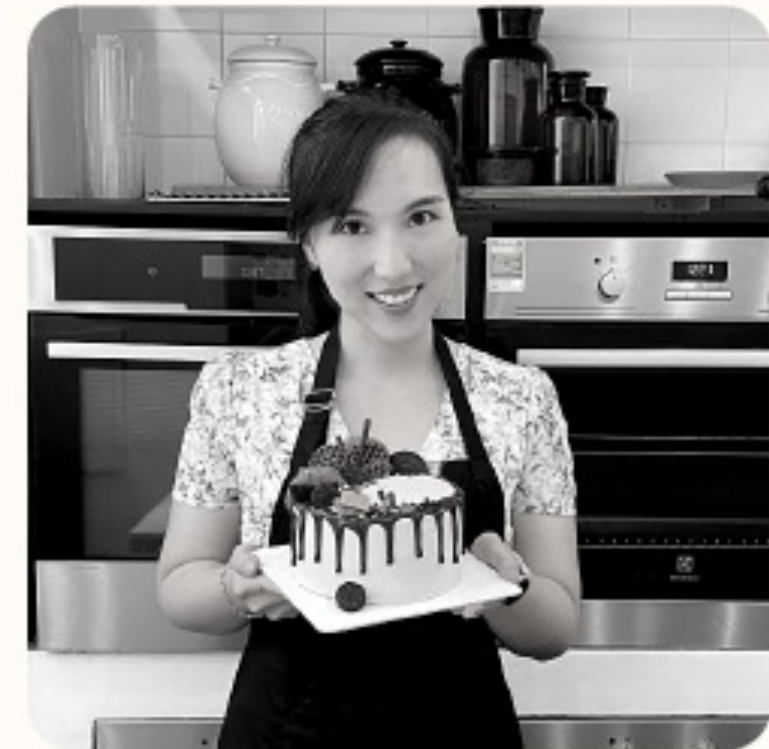
